

**Rémy Prud'homme**

Rémy Prud'homme studied business administration and economics at the University of Paris and at Harvard. He has been a Professor of economics at the Universities of Phnom-Penh, Lille, and Paris XII (since 1977) where he is now Professor emeritus, and also Visiting Professor at the MIT (1982-83, 1988-89, 1998, 2002). For several years, he worked with the OECD, as deputy-director of the Environment directorate. His main interests are in public finance and in transportation economics. He has been a frequent consultant to a number of governments, enterprises, and international organizations, particularly the World Bank, where he was invited as a Visiting Research Scholar, but also the European Union, the OECD, or the Inter-American Development Bank. He served on the board of the International Institute of Public Finance, and of the French Economic Association. He has written a number of scholarly books and papers, and contributed about 100 articles to *Le Monde* and *Le Figaro*, two leading French dailies.
