

Rémy Prud'homme

Rémy Prud'homme is presently Professor emeritus at the University of Paris XII and consultant. He studied business administration at HEC, and economics at the University of Paris and at Harvard. He has been a Professor of economics at the Universities of Phnom-Penh, Lille, and Paris XII (since 1977), and also Visiting Professor at the MIT (1982-83, 1988-89, 1998 and 2002). For several years, he worked with the OECD, as deputy-director of the Environment directorate.

His main interests are in local public finance, urban and regional policies, environmental policies, and –increasingly so– transportation policies. He has been a member of many French government advisory committees (such as the the PEON commission that prepared the French nuclear programme) and a frequent consultant to a number of governments and international organizations, particularly the World Bank, where he was invited as a Visiting Research Scholar, but also the European Economic Union, the OECD, or the Inter American Development Bank. He is or has been a board member of the International Institute of Public Finance, and of the French Economic Association. He created and led for 15 years L'OEIL, a small research team based at the University of Paris XII.

His main books are: *Environmental Policies in Japan* (1978), *The Management of Nature* (1980, in French), *Urban Transportation and Economic Development in Brazil* (1983, in French), *The Future of the Automobile* (with M. Frybourg, 1986, in French), *Financing Infrastructures* (with G. Terny, 1987, in French), *Regional Policies in Turkey* (1988), *Regional Policies in Poland* (1992), *Is Our Present Transport System Sustainable?* (1999). He has contributed about 100 articles to *Le Monde* and *Le Figaro*, the two leading French dailies.
